## Executive Summary

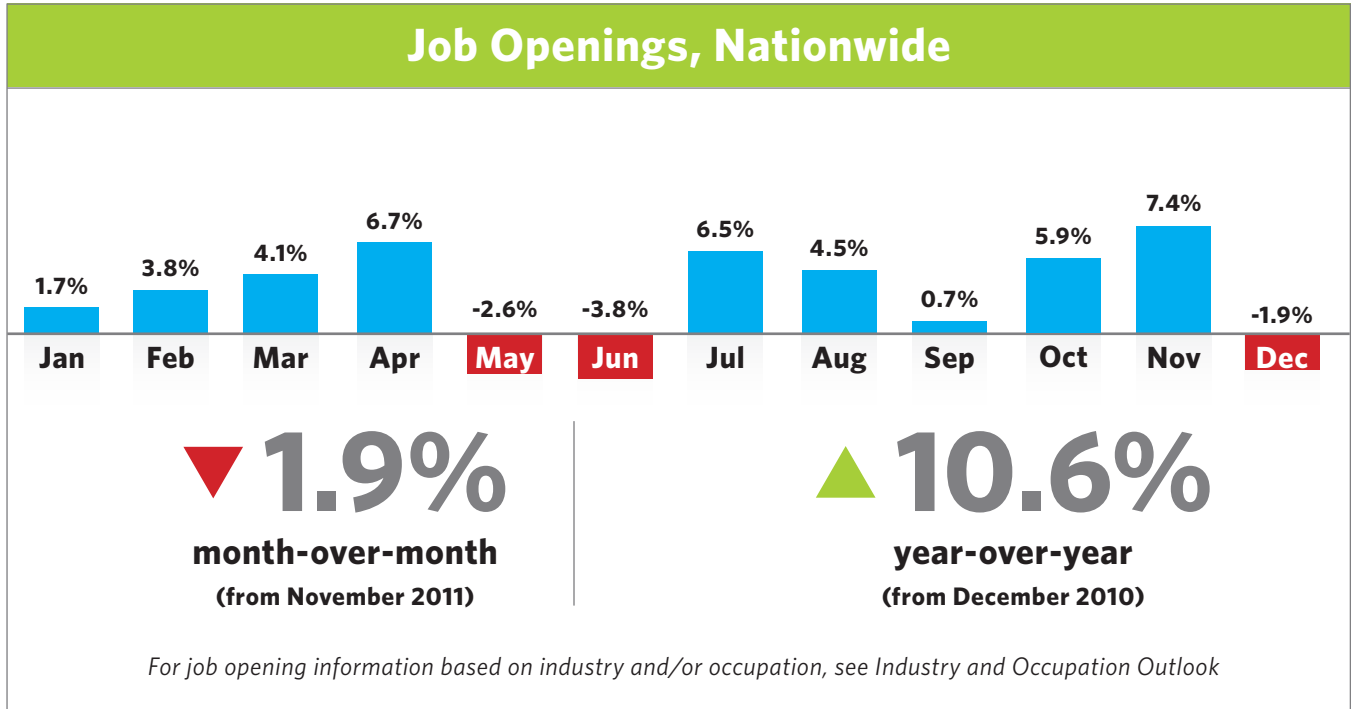
- Nationwide hiring slows slightly at year end.** Nationwide job openings decreased just slightly in December, down 1.9% month-over-month. As December is traditionally a slow month for hiring, the decline is expected, but growth was still up 10.6% year-over-year from 2010. “We’ve seen job openings decline nearly eight percent in December,” said Gautam Godhwani, CEO of SimplyHired.com. “That this year’s decrease was just below two percent indicates that the hiring market is healthy, and should get off to a good start in January.”
- Hiring increases in six metros.** Despite the overall slowdown in hiring, six of the top 50 metros experienced increases in job openings in the last month of the year. Raleigh & Durham posted the greatest increase, up 2.7%, followed by Birmingham, Norfolk & Newport News, Louisville, Sacramento and Oklahoma City.
- Some industries increase hiring.** In addition to the seasonally-boosted transportation industry, nine other industries experienced job growth in December. The legal industry had by far the largest growth (121.9%), followed by non-profit, agriculture, military, government, automotive, healthcare, education and technology.

### Employment Impact: Year End

- Continued need for transportation workers.** The transportation industry continued to enjoy a seasonal boost in the last month of the year due to the increased demand for package transport. Job openings for the industry as a whole grew 11.7% month-over-month, while openings for drivers, pilots and transportation workers were up 11.1%.

# Local Market Outlook

## HIGHLIGHTS

- Hiring slows in most metros.** Forty-four out of 50 top metros posted month-over-month decreases in job openings, as expected at the end of the year. The three metros with the greatest declines were Salt Lake City (-9.9%), St. Louis (-7.9%) and Greenville (-5.9%).
- 12 metros now less competitive.** Twelve metros became better for job seekers in December, including Las Vegas, Detroit, St. Louis, Memphis, Grand Rapids, Harrisburg, Austin, Seattle & Tacoma, Kansas City, Dallas & Fort Worth and Nashville. Most notable is Las Vegas, which also declined in competitiveness the previous month.

# Industry and Occupation Outlook

## HIGHLIGHTS

- Significant increase in legal jobs.** Job openings in the legal industry increased a substantial 121.9% month-over-month. Hiring in the industry declined consistently for the first half of 2011, before picking up again in July, after which openings increased minimally.
- Increased jobs in finance.** While most occupation categories declined in December, several actually increased. Financial specialists and accountants had the greatest increase, up 13.2% month-over-month. Job openings for transportation, media and healthcare workers also increased.

# Top Hiring Companies by Metro

## HIGHLIGHTS

- **Companies pause hiring.** Seventy-three of 125 company locations posted decreases in job openings in December, compared to 36 in November and just 31 in October. The nation's top employers should resume hiring in January 2012.
- **Increased jobs in health and tech companies.** Of the companies that did not reduce their job openings, trucking company Ryder had the greatest increases. Many healthcare and technology companies had substantial increases as well, like Baylor Health Care, HCA, WakeMed Health, Intel and eBay.
