## Executive Summary

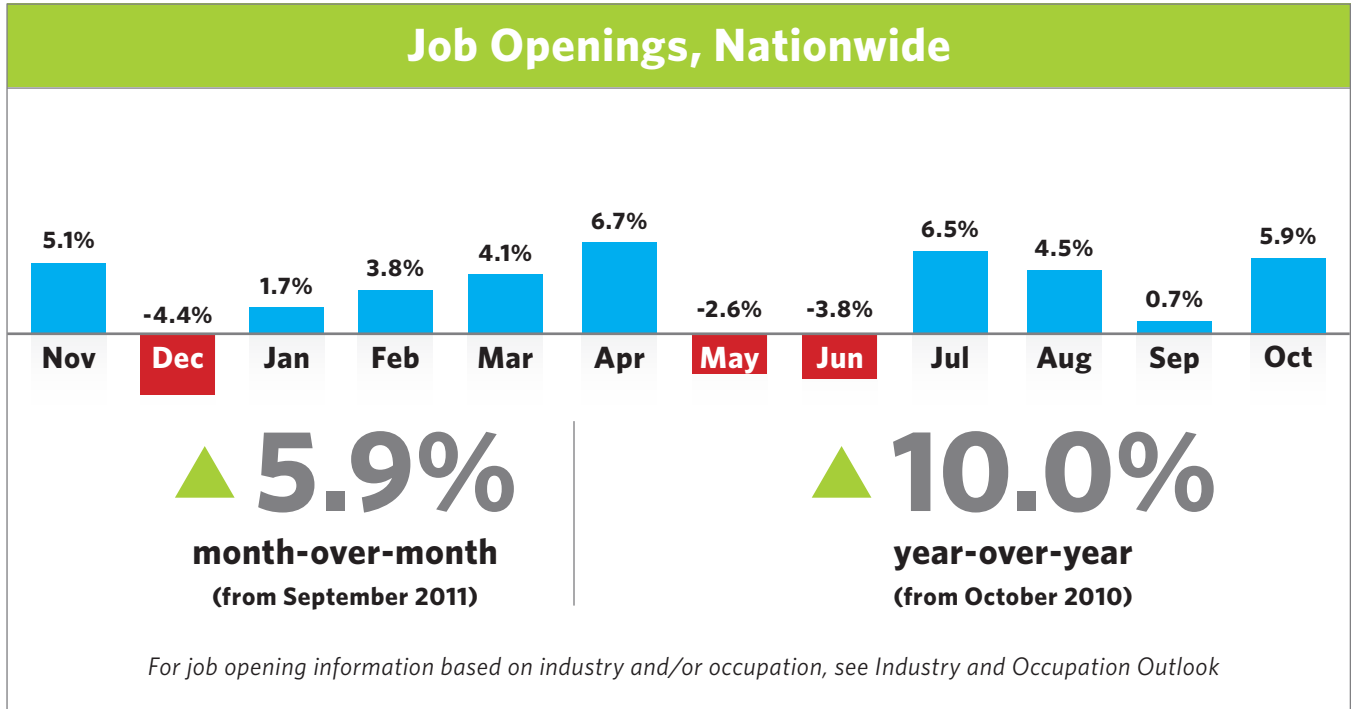
- **Nationwide hiring remains positive.** Nationwide job openings increased for the fourth consecutive month, up 5.9% month-over-month and 10.0% year-over-year. Openings were previously up 0.7% month-over-month and 9.0% year-over-year. "Hiring remained positive this month due to continued seasonal hiring," said Gautam Godhwani, CEO of SimplyHired.com. "Positive job growth is anticipated through the end of the year as the result of further seasonal hiring for Thanksgiving and later holidays."
- **Most major metros experience job growth.** All 50 metros saw positive month-over-month growth in October, with 47 of 50 metros also posting positive year-over-year growth. Job competition remained similar to last month; Miami & Fort Lauderdale and Las Vegas held stable as the most competitive metros for job seekers, both with an 8:1 job competition ratio.
- **Strong transportation hiring.** Transportation hiring posted a 45.7% month-over-month and 108.1% year-over-year increase, the largest increases in industry hiring in October. Ten of twenty-two industries reported declines in hiring this month, compared to only five last month.

### Employment Impact: Holiday Hiring

- **Retail hiring continues to see growth.** The retail industry posted a 94.4% year-over-year growth, despite a month-over-month drop in hiring (-8.6%) due most likely to the break between the Halloween and Thanksgiving holidays. Job openings for retail salespersons were up 86.1% this month, just shy of last month's 88.8% growth. Retail hiring will continue to see an increase due to seasonal hiring through the end of the year.

# Local Market Outlook

## HIGHLIGHTS

- Hiring up again in all metros.** All 50 major metro areas posted positive month-over-month hiring in October. Only three metros had year-over-year declines: New York (-6.2%), San Francisco Bay Area (-3.0%) and Hartford & New Haven (-0.2%).
- Little change in job competition.** Miami & Fort Lauderdale and Las Vegas remained the most competitive metros for job seekers, both with a job competition ratio of 8:1. Washington, DC and Oklahoma City tied as the least competitive metros each with a 1:1 ratio. Kansas City (3:1) improved the most for job seekers this month.

# Industry and Occupation Outlook

## HIGHLIGHTS

- Most industries continue growth.** Sixteen of eighteen industries had increases in job openings in October, up slightly from September. Industries posting decreases include agriculture (-18.8%) and retail (-8.6%). Despite a month-over-month decrease in retail hiring, the retail industry remains positive year-over-year (94.4%).
- Legal hiring declines.** Hiring for lawyers, judges and legal support professionals posted a decrease of -37.2% year-over-year. Similarly, ten of the twenty-two occupational categories saw a decrease in year-over-year hiring, including construction and agricultural workers.

# Top Hiring Companies by Metro

## HIGHLIGHTS

- **Hiring increases after slight dip.** Thirty-one of 125 company locations saw declines in month-over-month hiring, compared to 47 in September, 27 in August, 42 in July and 73 in June. As expected, hiring increased from last month due to seasonal hiring in industries like retail.
- **Healthcare companies are top hirers.** Healthcare companies were top employers in just under half of all company locations (61 of 125). Healthcare companies rank in the top five of all 25 metropolitan areas.
